## **BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (BCA)**

The duration of BCA program is three years consisting six semesters. There shall be examination at the end of each semester. The medium of introduction and examination shall be English.

### **ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS**

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination (in any stream i.e. Science, Arts, Commerce, Vocational etc.) from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, with 40% marks (35% marks in case of SC/ST candidates)

**OR**

Any examination of a Board/University/College/School in a Foreign Country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalence committee or on the recommendation of association of Indian University, with 40% marks (35% in case of SC/ST candidates).

### **NUMBER OF SEATS**

Subsidies Seats	30
Non-Subsidized Seats	30
Total Seats	60

Subsidized Seats: As per University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from the school situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

### **AGE LIMIT**

Maximum age limit for the admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for the girl candidates as on 1<sup>st</sup> July of the year 2024. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

### **BASIS OF ADMISSION**

The admission will purely be on the basis of percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in 10+2. If there is a tie then first, the percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in matriculation will be considered, and second the candidates older in age will be given preference.

### **TRAINING**

One month short term training and minor project submission will be mandatory for each student after the examination of 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> semester.

## SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION

The pass percentage in each subject will be 40%

### I) Theory Papers:

For Regular students each paper will be of 100 marks (70 marks for End Semester Examination and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours.

- i) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- ii) End-Semester Examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

### Note:

1. A student will have to pass both the components (i.e.) CCA and ESE separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.
2. The ratio of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and End-Semester Examination (ESE) would remain unchanged (i.e. 30:70) for the students of the academic session admitted in 2019, 2020 and 2021 respectively.

**Mid-Term (Minor) Test-**There will be one mid-term test, to be conducted when approximately 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This mid-term test will be for 15 marks. Mid term test will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teacher.

**Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper-**The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment/term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

**End-semester Examination (ESE):** The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end-semester examination (ESE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

**Note:** Eligible students of PGDCA can also avail the benefits of Center/ State scholarship schemes and Kaushal Vikas Bhatta.

### ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

Candidates who have passed graduation in any stream from the recognized university or its equivalent with at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Maximum age limit for admission to PGDCA course is 26 Years for general category, 29 Years for SC/ST Category and 28 Years for girl candidates as on 1<sup>st</sup> July of the Year 2024.

### BASIS OF ADMISSION

The admission will be purely on the basis of percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in graduation. If there is tie then first, the percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in 10+2 will be considered, and if again a tie then the older candidates will be given preference.



- Note:-** 1. Fee once deposited shall be refunded as per the AICTE norms.  
 2. 75% attendance is compulsory for all.  
 3. If a student wants admission in hostel, its charges will have to be paid separately. Hostel Admission will be on merit basis.

Three question are to be set from PART-A and four from PART-B of the syllabus. Student is required to attempt two questions from each PART. Question No. 8 will be compulsory covering the entire syllabus of at least 5 parts.

### INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

25 marks are allotted in each paper for internal assessment. Internal assessment will be given on the basis of class test and attendance.

Maximum Marks (Theory & Internal Assessment) will be 100.

## BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

The duration of BBA course is three years consisting six semesters. There will be examination at the end of each semester.

### ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, with 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Or

Any examination of a Board/University/School in a Foreign Country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalent committee or on the recommendation of Association of Indian university, with 50% marks (45% in case of SC/ST candidates).

As per H.P. University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from schools situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

### AGE LIMIT

Maximum age limit for the admission to BBA course is 22 years for general category and 25 years for SC/ST candidates, as on 1<sup>st</sup> July of the year 2024. Relaxation of three years is given to SC/ST candidates and the Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months

### BASIS OF ADMISSION

Admission shall be made on the basis of merit determined on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 examination. A candidate with commerce or Mathematics at plus two levels will be given additional 10% of the percentage marks obtained in plus two, while computing merit for admission. If there is tie then first, the percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in matriculation will be considered, and if again a tie the candidate older in age will be given preference.

## **RESERVATION of seats in BBA/ BCA and PGDCA**

Admission shall be subject to the following conditions:

- A. 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for SC and ST candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H P Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh from any other Board like CBSE or ICSE, etc.
- B. The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under:
  - 1.25% of seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination
  2. 75% of seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H P Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh from any other Board like CBSE or ICSE, etc. subject to the following reservations:
    - a. 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding Sportsmen/Women.
    - b. 5% of seats shall be reserved for outstanding cultural activists.
    - c. 5% of seats shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates.
    - d. Provided that the minimum eligibility for admission to the course in the case of SC/ST will be 5% lower than the eligibility condition for other students.
    - e. 10% seats shall be reserved for students belong to Economically Weaker Section (Wide Letter No. 3-60/20 HPU (Genl.) dated 4 Dec. 2020).
    - e. One seat over & above is reserved for Single Girl Child (only child of parents, that too a girl).
    - f. The rules of H P University shall be applicable in the case of above reservations in the college.
